

Qualifications of a Spending Plan Coach

A Coach must be a Christian. He or she must have a growing personal relationship with Jesus Christ and should depend solely on the person of Jesus Christ for salvation.

A Coach is one who has identified his/her gifts and has had those gifts affirmed by others.

A Coach consistently models in his/her life the principles of good stewardship which undergird the ministry. For example, each coach should be living on a budget. The coach's financial life need not be totally free from past financial errors, but should be one that is moving toward responsible Christian goals.

A Coach must attend and complete the Coach Training Workshop. Prior to the course, coaches are to read the pre-reading section of the "Budget Counselor Training Workshop Participant's Guide and Manual".

A Coach must agree to faithfully serve the ministry within the format designed by its leaders, as well as agree to teach and coach his/her clients in a manner consistent with the Biblical Financial Principles outlined by the Financial Stewardship Ministry.

A Coach may not sell or profit from a product or service he or she can offer to an individual or family he or she is personally working with or have come in contact with as a result of serving under Grace's Spending Plan Assistance.
